Recommendation

Issue / Opportunity

London Public Library is committed to listening to the needs, expectations and concerns of library users, members of the community and other stakeholders. We welcome their input in shaping our policies, programs and services.

The Library Board has an existing delegation process that is quite vague and outdated and does not provide appropriate guidelines for delegations to be heard by the Library Board. In order to effectively accommodate public input, the current policy was reviewed and updated. Benchmarking was undertaken to review Delegation Policies of other public institutions (see Appendix 1) and to identify best practices. A policy was drafted and updated by the committee and the final draft is before the board for approval by the full Library Board.
